Over 3,500 food baskets will be given out to help stretch exhausted budgets. Some items cannot be collected through food drives: diapers, formula, and other perishables are very expensive.



Volunteers mentor over 120 children in one-on-one learning so they remain in school, learn and can be successful later in life. This supports both formal education and making appropriate behavior choices leading to good adult life choices as well.

School readiness skills are provided to over 300 preschool children. A good start includes learning how to listen, knowing alphabet and numbers, as well as respecting others and participating appropriately



Disabilities can occur at any time. They may last a short recuperative period or a lifetime. Individuals coping with disability need support and training to live as independently as possible. 339 individuals are able to participate in social, recreational, learning, and work opportunities.



Children often have few safe, affordable, healthy options for summer activities. Parents may find challenge in finding childcare during the summer months.

To prevent the 'summer slip' and allow children this very type of environment, summer camps are offered through different programs at little or no cost to many families.
